

Two Year Postdoctoral Fellowship in PTSD and Substance Use Disorders

University of Washington - Innovative Programs Research Group (IPRG)

Beginning Spring/Summer 2019 through Spring/Summer 2021 (2nd year contingent upon funding)

Position: We are seeking a full-time postdoctoral fellow to work on a large Department of Defense grant to develop and test a brief telephone-delivered motivational enhancement intervention for military personnel who are not currently in treatment and who report symptoms of PTSD at the University of Washington Innovative Programs Research Group (IPRG).

Responsibilities:

- The Senior Fellow will oversee all components of the study, with particular emphasis on the development and implementation of the data collection, management, and analysis functions.
- He/she will supervise the assessor for the purpose of ensuring adherence to assessment, tracking, and data management protocols.
- The Project Director will assist in the supervision of the Counselors for the purpose of ensuring adherence to the therapy manuals.
- Working with the study investigators, the he/she will conduct data analyses using appropriate statistical strategies.
- The Senior Fellow will prepare regular and periodic status reports concerning participant enrollment, attendance, attrition and retention, and tracking. He/she will also hold key responsibilities in data analyses pertaining to the aims and research questions associated with the study.

Requirements: Candidates should have solid research training, including evidence of scholarly productivity and some background in cognitive-behavioral therapy or motivational interviewing. Postdoctoral fellows should have completed their Ph.D. The start of the position is negotiable, with a desired start date in Spring/Summer of 2019.
