MISSION

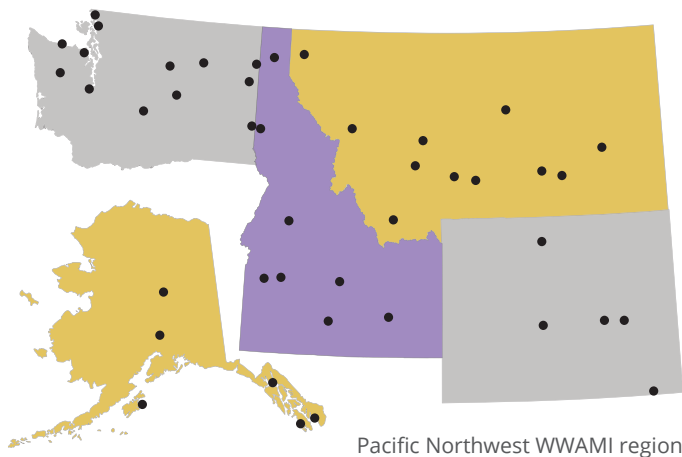
